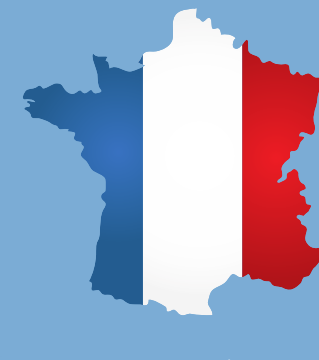


French-speaking countries around the world



LANGUAGE AND DIALECT DIFFERENCES

AROUND 300 MILLION PEOPLE IN THE WORLD SPEAK FRENCH. IT IS THE OFFICIAL LANGUAGE IN 29 COUNTRIES, AND 11 FRENCH OVERSEAS TERRITORIES

Canadian French

Québécois French is spoken in Quebec. The grammar is the same as standard French but the accent is more nasal.

Acadian French is spoken on the maritime coast of Canada.

Standard French

Parisian or Metropolitan French is considered Standard European French.

Other dialects in France include Marseillais, Occitan, Breton, Basque, Alsatian, Auvergnat and Corsican.

Belgian French

A slightly different accent to standard French and influenced by Dutch. The letter 'r' has more emphasis, and some numbers are pronounced differently. The number 70 is pronounced 'septante' rather than 'soixante-dix'.

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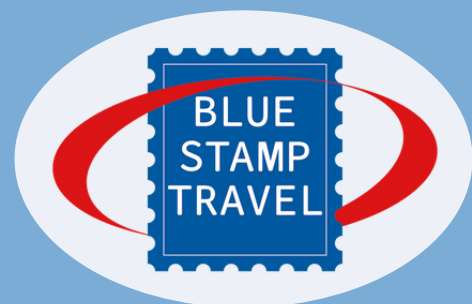
Haitian Creole

French spoken in Haiti; includes a mixture of African languages as well as other languages from colonial rule, such as Spanish and Portuguese.

African French

It is entirely based on standard French, and incorporates a wide range of variations and dialects, as the language is spread across 34 territories and countries in Africa. Pronunciation can differ notably, particularly with the letter R, as well as the letters D, T, L and N.
