### **Angela Merkel**

Angela Merkel **(born 17th July 1954)** is a German **politician** who served as Chancellor of Germany from 2005 to 2021. A trained physicist, she transitioned into politics after the fall of the Berlin Wall, joining the Christian Democratic Union (CDU). Merkel became Germany's first female chancellor and played a key role in European and global affairs, managing economic and political challenges. She retired from politics in 2021 after 16 years in office.



#### Thomas Müller

### Heidi Klum

Heidi Klum **(born 1st June 1973)** is a German **model**, **television host, and businesswoman**. She gained international fame as a Victoria's Secret Angel and was the first German model to appear on the cover of Sports Illustrated Swimsuit Issue. Klum later became a prominent TV personality, hosting *Project Runway* and *Germany's Next Topmodel*. She has also pursued ventures in fashion, acting, and philanthropy.





Daniel Brühl **(born 16th June 1978)** is a German-Spanish **actor** known for his roles in Good Bye Lenin!, Inglourious Basterds, and Rush. He has appeared in international films and TV series, including the Marvel Cinematic Universe as Baron Zemo. Brühl has received critical acclaim for his performances and is also involved in directing and producing.





















### Albert Einstein (1879-1955)

Albert Einstein was a German-born theoretical physicist known for developing the theory of relativity. His equation E = mc<sup>2</sup> became one of the most famous in science. He received the 1921 Nobel Prize in Physics for his work on the photoelectric effect. Einstein played a key role in modern physics and later advocated for peace and humanitarian causes.



### Ludwig van Beethoven
