We use por to express the reason or cause of something (the rain caused me to stay at home).



DURATION

Vivió en Londres por tres años.
She lived in London for three years

Por is used to talk about a period of time (how long something lasts).

EXCHANGE

Compré el libro por diez libras.
I bought the book for ten pounds.

Por is used when talking about money or exchange (what you give in return for something).



MOVEMENT / PLACE


Caminamos por el parque.
We walked through the park.


Por expresses movement through or around a place.

Por is used to express the means or method of communication or transport.







PARA

Para expresses a goal or purpose (the objective).

This present is for you.

Para is used to show who receives something.

DESTINATION

Sale para Manchester mañana.
She is leaving for Manchester tomorrow.

Para expresses a final destination.



DEADLINE

El proyecto es para el viernes.
The project is due for Friday.

Para is used to express a deadline or specific date.

OPINION

Para mí, esta película es excelente.
For me, this film is excellent.

Para is used to express a personal opinion or point of view.
